

This new feature was launched in July 2014 to commemorate the 21<sup>st</sup> Anniversary of the Pamagirri Aboriginal Experience at Rainforestation Nature Park. It allows visitors from around the world to leave their painted handprint alongside those of others from different cultures, including the first Australians, to symbolically demonstrate understanding, peace and unity amongst us all.

This new experience consists of the following elements -

- Introductory talk to learn about the significance of hand prints and cave paintings in Aboriginal Culture. A Pamagirri Guide will talk about how hand prints were seen as a personal permanent signature and they will also talk about the different styles of cave paintings, for example dot paintings, x-ray paintings and spray painting.
- Each group participant will then be able to place their own hand print on the wall with a sink close by to wash their hands afterwards. Later when the paint is dry, they will be able to return later and write a message in their palm print.
- Each participant will then be able to take their own photo as a permanent memento for themselves.
